Coast to Coast Rally 2006

April 29/30

Port Alberni – Parksville, BC Round 2 of the BC TSD Rally Championship Round 1 of Pacific Coast Challenge and Round 2 of the Island Rally Series

This is a "Brisk" TSD rally covering over 700km of choice mainline and secondary gravel roads in central Vancouver Island using straight forward instructions. It is a part of the BC TSD Rally Championship, Pacific Coast Challenge and Island TSD series. The Coast to Coast Rally follows the 2006 BC TSD Rally Regulations as well as the CARS General Competition Rules. Scoring:

This rally will consist of several Legs, each ending in a gas or food stop, and each Leg will be separated into several Regularities and Transits. Regularities are sections in which hidden controls will record the time each competitor passes; and Transits will be untimed sections where competitors pass free of controls. The distance between gas stops will not exceed 200 kilometers.

Timing will be recorded at hidden drive-by controls. This means you don't stop. If you slow down suddenly or stop in front of a control, they may choose to score you at the estimated time you would have passed by at their discretion if they feel you are balking. Controls will not be placed within 200m of the beginning or end of a regularity, nor will they be placed within 200m of a STOP, YIELD or TRAFFIC SIGNAL.

Scoring is done by timing to the second - 1 penalty point per second late or early with 1 second grace on either side of perfect time. The goal is to follow the average speeds given and stay on time to achieve the lowest score possible. Ties will be broken by the greatest number of zeros, followed by ones, etc. The speeds will always be 10% below the posted limit; and transit sections allow ample time to reach the other end without exceeding the speed limit. The maximum penalty for any given checkpoint is 300 points (5 minutes) to a maximum of 600 points over any single regularity. Controls will be in place until all entrants have passed or until 5 minutes after the scheduled arrival time of the last car not seen, whichever comes first.

Exceptions to the scoring: Competitors who come upon an accident scene are expected to render aid if possible. The time and mileage of any incidents and time lost should be recorded and presented to the organizer(s) in writing on the form provided in the route book. From this point, the competitors shall carry on as if on proper time and **not** make up time. Competitors will be scored at this new time for the remainder of the Regularity unless the incident did not occur as presented. Therefore, time must not be made up until the end of that Regularity. For more information, see Appendix C of the 2006 BC TSD Rally Regulations.

Miscellaneous

- 1. Written permission of the owner of each vehicle entered is required for use of the vehicle in this rally.
- 2. In the case where a competitor is stranded but not injured or in any danger, rally traffic should be waved past; and the crew should wait for assistance from the sweep vehicle.

<u>Classes and Awards</u> - There will be awards given for first overall as well as 1st place driver/navigator in each of the following classes:

Unlimited: Unlimited Equipment

Calculator: Accessory Odometers, non-programmable calculating devices which are not driven by a wheel

Novice: Neither crew member having entered more than 3 rallies previous to the competition year;

Navigation equipment limited to Calculator Class or less

Paper: No Calculating devices, tables or Accessory Odometers

Historic: Vehicles manufactured before December 31, 1973 as per date stamped on vehicle registration;

Navigation equipment limited to Calculator Class or less

For the purpose of Pacific Coast Challenge (PCC) and Island Rally Series (IRS) points, Unlimited will be classed as Unlimited; Calculator, Novice and Historic will be classed as Equipped; and Paper will be classed as SOP.

Required Equipment:

- Self-Supporting Reflective Warning Triangle (minimum 12" per side)
- Fire Extinguisher (minimum 5BC, prefer 10BC)
- Full Size Spare Tire(s), Jack, Tire Wrench
- **UPDATED** First Aid Kit (see http://www.rallybc.com/archives/2005/2005FirstAidKit.htm for required kit)
- Open cars require a roll bar
- Cars equipped with auxiliary lights must be able to turn off lights with high beams with only one switch leaving only low beams operating. Factory fog lights may be operated independently.

- Map light
- Pen, Highlighter, Clipboard, Accurate Digital Timepiece
- Appropriate Navigational Equipment for the Class Entered
- Auxiliary Lights
- Sense of Adventure and Enthusiasm!
